The Ohio Reined Cow Horse Association Offers Special Bridle Spectacular for August Show!

Weekend Event Also Includes NRCHA-Sanctioned Horse Show Offers \$1,000 Added Each Day!

The Ohio Reined Cow Horse Association's 2011 events schedule continues with a NRCHA-sanctioned Horse Show at Henderson Arena in Jackson, OH, August 26-28, 2011, which will include its 2nd Annual Summer Spectacular and Green Weekend!

Holding true to its dedication for being a place where everyone can experience the thrill of cow horse competition, the ORCHA will present a Bridle Spectacular event for riders that have less than \$100 dollars in NRCHA earnings. The event is designed to let ORCHA riders who would not normally participate in a bridle spectacular an opportunity compete in such an event.

ORCHA riders much compete in their regular herd work and the designated ORCHA Bridle Spectacular classes on Saturday, which include Open Stock Horse Fence, Non Pro Stock Horse Fence, Non Pro Limited, and Youth Limited. NRCHA and ORCHA rules for each class will apply and horses can show in age appropriate headgear. Scores from herd work and designated classes on Saturday will be combined to determine the winner for each division. Buckles will be awarded to the winners!

The weekend's show will start with herd work on Friday, August 26, at 4pm, with the two NRCHA-sanctioned horse show beginning Saturday, August 27, and Sunday, August 28, with \$1,000 added each day.
